THE DIRT ROAD

ARE YOU NEXT?

This item is being written following the C.F.I.'s report to the club annual meeting at the beginning of April. It was a pleasure to report a year of safe flying. Unfortunately the same could not be said of our driving performance.

This caused me to look back over our statistics for the last five years. This picture has been fairly consistant. Our club members achieve one or two major accidents easth year on the dirt road between Lochiel and the airfield. Other minor fender benders occur which don't even rate a mention. Statistics would indicate that the most likely timing of accidents is in the period following "O" week when new members are first driving to Lochiel and also when the first winter rains turn the road to a skid pan.

Turning the statistics into dollars the equation looks something like this:

- * Annual average damage bill: \$10,000
- * The damage represents something like \$3 for every launch on the airfield
- * The damage represents something like \$200/year for each person driving to the airfield.

A little thought on the issue would reveal that we suffer from a driver training/experience gap. Generally club members driving to Lochiel haven't held a licence for many years. Most have passed conventional driver training in Adelaide or other centres where all training and testing is carried out on sealed roads and skid control is not part of the practical syllabus. In many instances the dirt between Lochiel and the airfied is the first significant stretch of unsealed road encountered by the driver.

There is an evens chance someone is going to wrap another car around a tree or a farmer's fence when the first rains of winter arrive. There is an uncomfortably high chance that it is going to be you. Since you're not bullet proof, next time you drive along the road have a look at those mallee trees, envisage what they look like rushing towards the driver's door when you've lost it and SLOW DOWN. Just for the record, whilst we have seen a continuing stream of cars demolished none has ever succeeded in knocking down a tree.


If you should ever get the chance to attend an advanced driving course covering skid control grab the opportunity. In the mean time continue to fly safely and drive to match.
