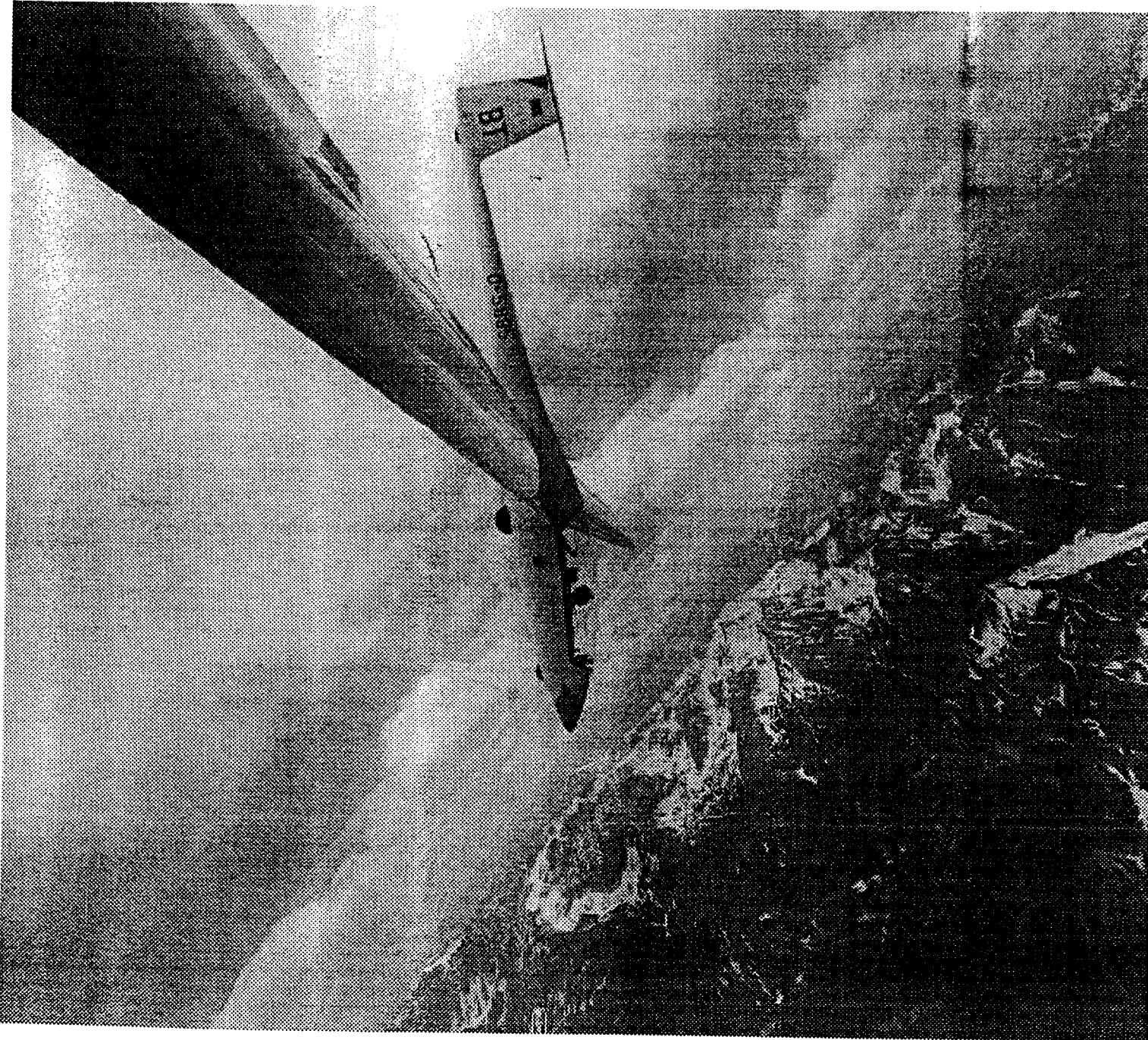

Editorial

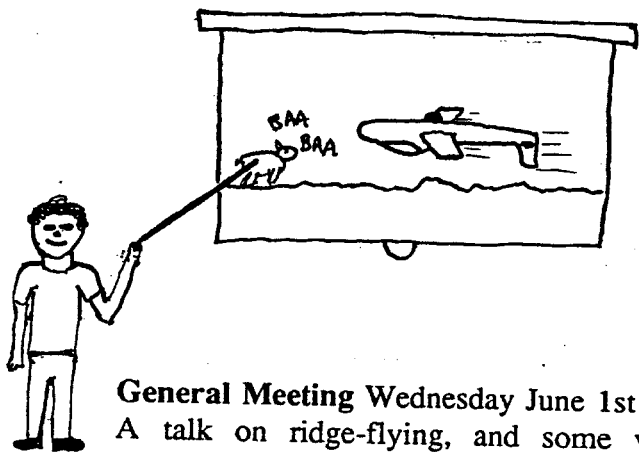
Hi Groovers!

bring your own tent. Last year's trip was a huge success, so come along this year and see for yourself!

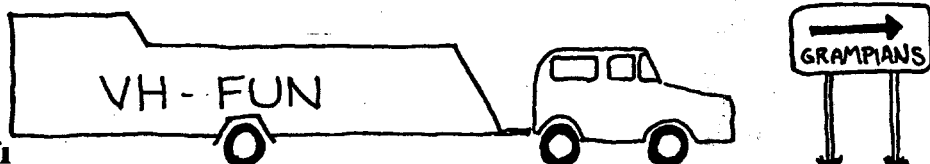
If you would like to participate, contact Scott Battersby as soon as possible. Final details will be sorted out at the General Meeting on June 1st.

West Beach

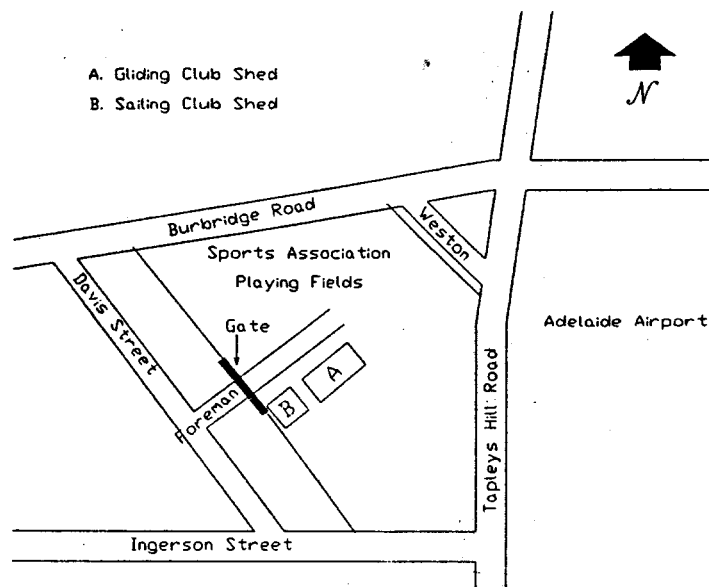
